

The skills that are listed in the diagram are helpful for children to know before entering Kindergarten. We are also including a **Sight Word List** which you can work on with your child. Please see these as hopes and aspirations, not expectations.



Please consider using the sight word list with your child to help ready them for Kindergarten. This list is set up in columns so you can cut-out the words and work with your child. The words are placed in emergent reading order, if your child has some phonemic awareness. If not, once they learn the letters in the alphabet the phonics from letter recognition will help them to learn the sounds.

Speak and Listen

- Use and understand many words
- Speak in complete sentences
- Ask lots of questions
- Say and notice words that rhyme in stories
- Make up and share personal stories about his or her interests

Read and Write

- Select familiar books and tell why he or she likes them. Retell favorite stories from books
- Hold a book upright.
- Identify letters of the alphabet
- Recognize letter sounds
- Recognize, copy and print his or her first name
- Hold a pencil and write with it.

Kindergarten Readiness Suggestions

Before your child enters school, he or she should be able to:

Use Mathematics

- Recognize and count up to ten items
- Recognize the number symbols 1-10
- Describe and talk about objects that have different sizes, colors, shapes and patterns
- Sort items by "same" and "different"
- Use the words "near", "far" "top", "bottom", "under", "first", "second", "last"
- Sort objects from smallest to largest, shortest to tallest and lightest to heaviest.

Participate and Cooperate

- Understand and participate in conversations
- Stay and involved in a directed activity to its completion
- Follow routines and directions
- Work and play together with other children
